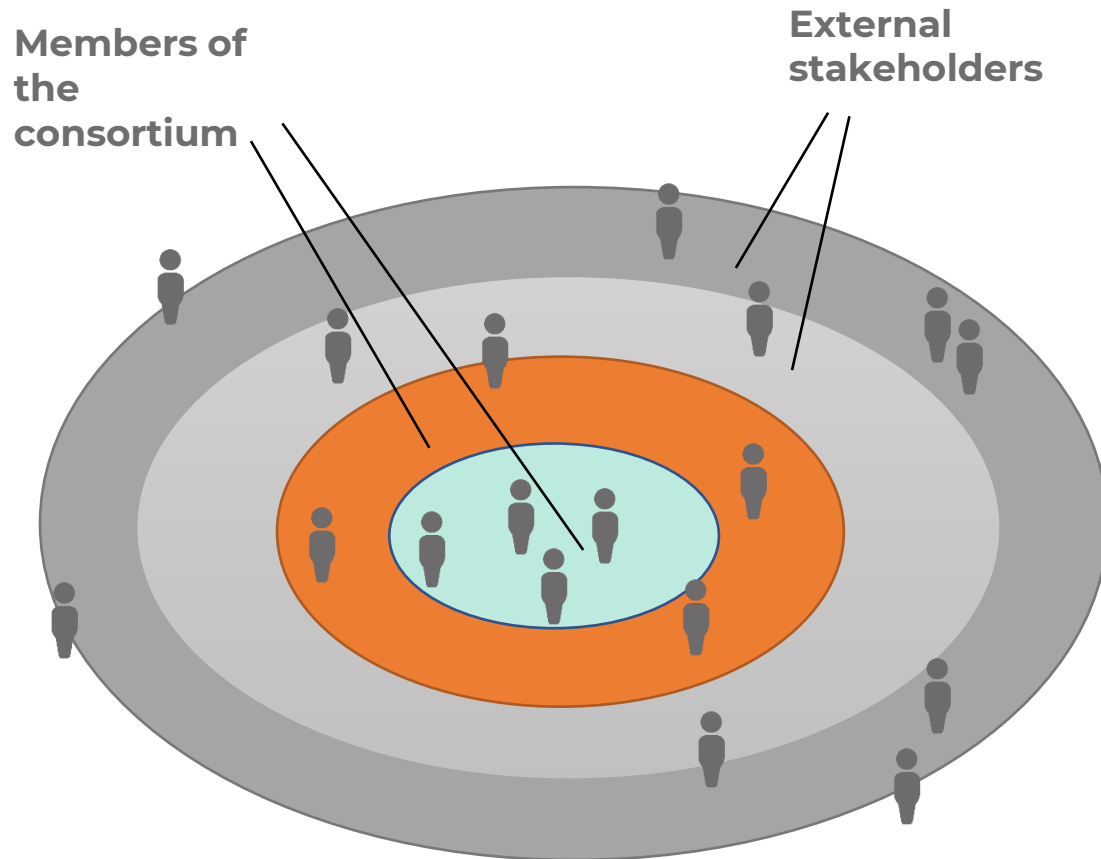

What to expect from this workshop?

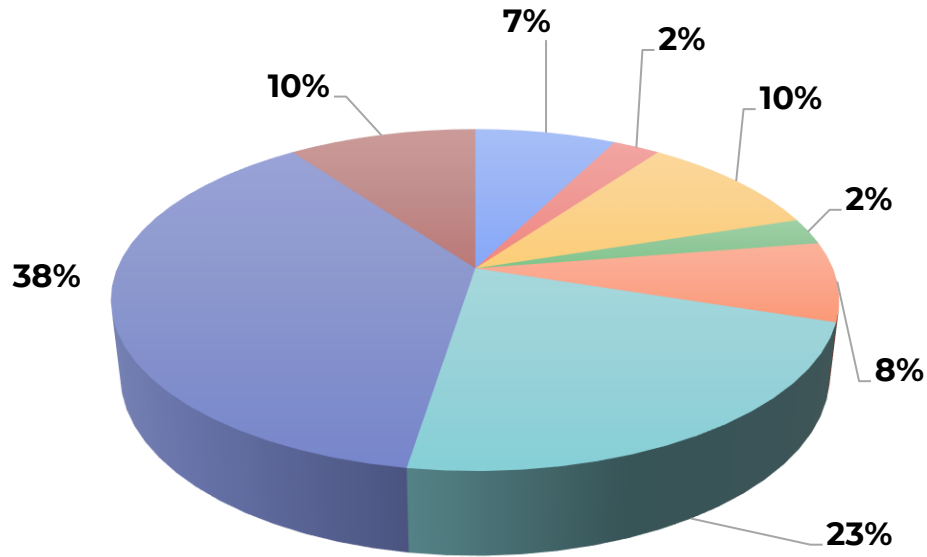


The **EU multi-actor working group** is formed by members of the consortium and other external relevant stakeholders involved in transition processes.

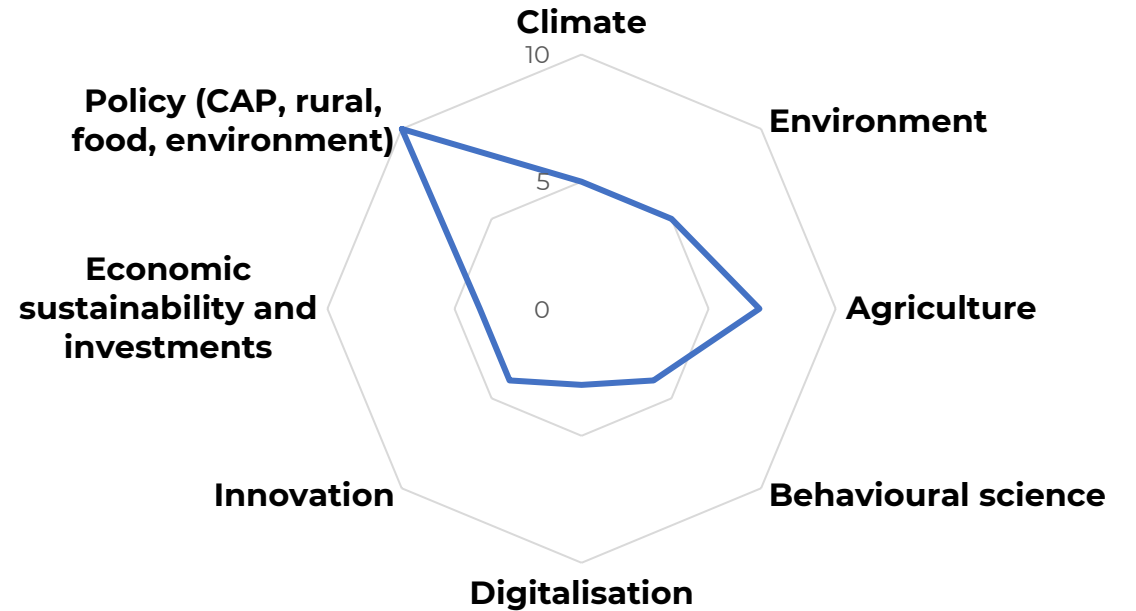
Experts insights from external actors will help us to:

- collect ideas on trends and policy proposals shaping the integration of Climate-Smart Agriculture (CSA) initiatives into the EU policy framework.

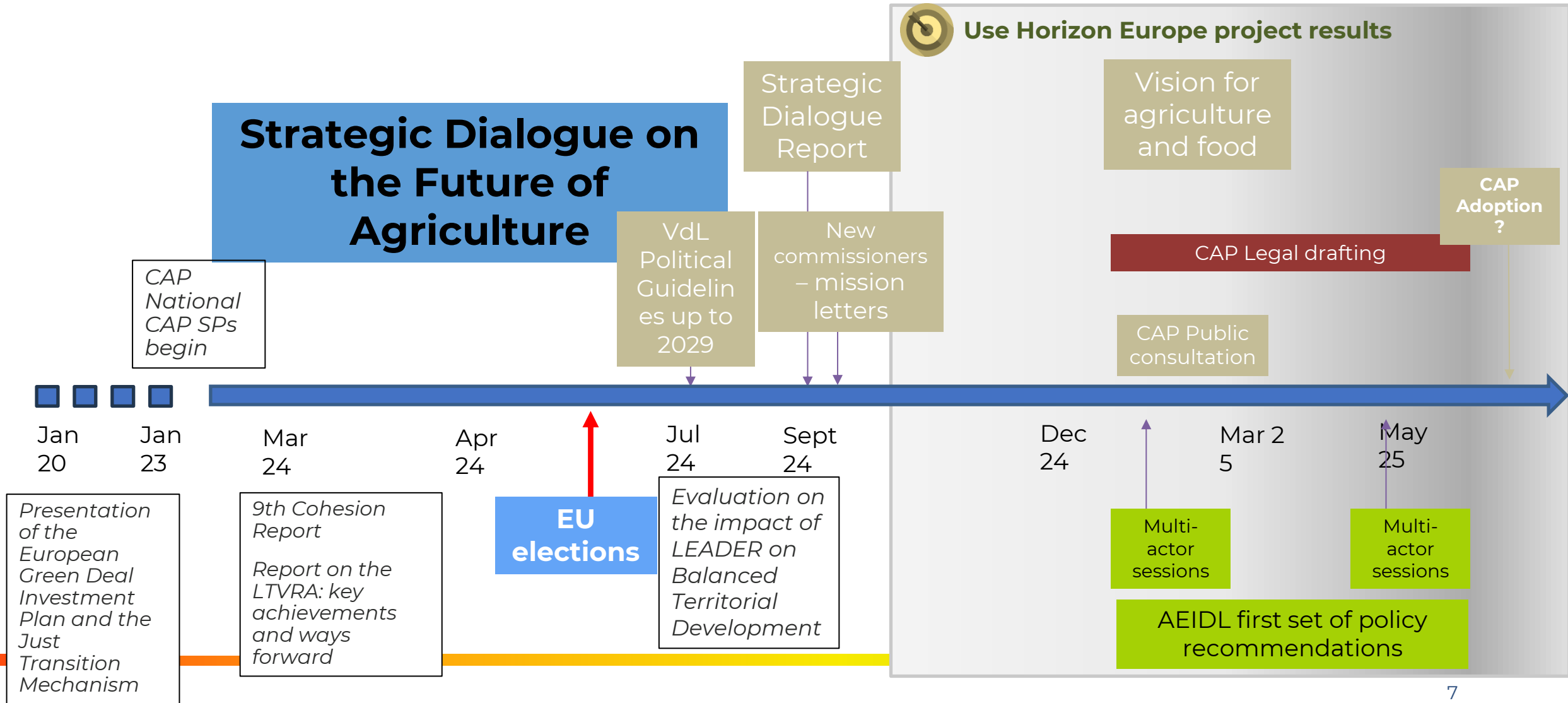
